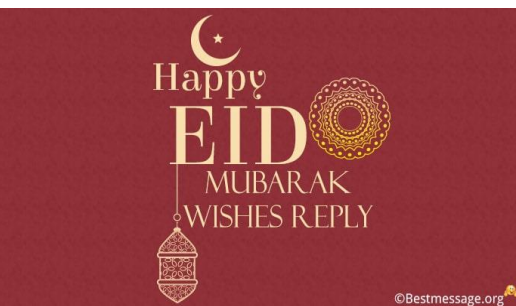

We are delighted to have Jarvis (Y3) and Ebony (Y5) join the junior and senior rooms.

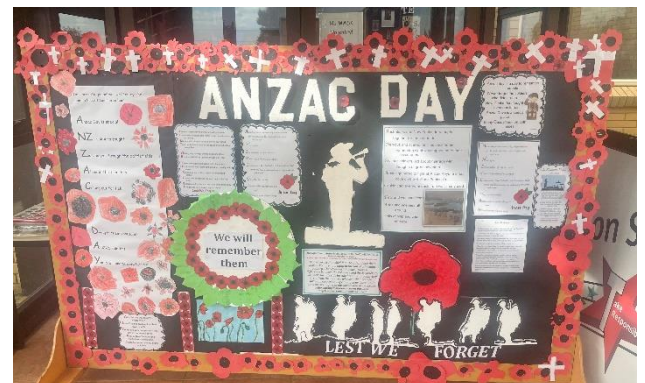


Working bee
