PB4L is a positive behaviour programme that endeavours to reward those kids that demonstrate the school's expectations of behaviour. The idea is to keep trying to teach the right way to interact and behave rather than simply punish those who don't – the ZONES programme is designed to teach kids to recognise triggers to escalating behaviour, recognise emotions and feelings in themselves and others so they can take steps to avoid escalating behaviour.
